

Currently, she is the Managing Director at Book-It Repertory Theatre in Seattle. She is a member of the Association of Performing Arts Presenters, the Society of Stage Directors and Choreographers and is past President of the Board of Arts Northwest, Theatre Puget Sound and has served on the board of the Pat Graney Dance Company among others. She has directed or produced over 80 productions, including *The Road to Mecca* and *The Vagina Monologues* at Stone Soup.

Annie Lareau (May)

Annie has had the great fortune to act and direct locally, nationally and internationally for the last seventeen years. Locally Annie has performed with Book-It Repertory Theatre, The Empty Space, Seattle Shakespeare Company, Wooden 'O', Arts West, Annex Theatre, Spokane Interplayers, New City, and Theater Schmeater. Other credits include: The Court Theatre, (New Zealand), Jennetta Cochran Theatre, (London), The Schollschberg, (Amsterdam), Berkshire Theatre Festival (Massachusetts), and Belfry Theatre, (British Columbia). Recent roles include: Antonia in My Antonia (Book-it Rep), Elizabeth in Richard III (Wooden O), and Nadia in The Vertical Hour (Arts West).
