# **Notes from the Director**

The Real Inspector Hound is Tom Stoppard at his best. He expertly plays with the ideas of fate vs. free will using the "play within a play" format. His wit and scathing wordplay brilliantly satirize murder mystery in the style of Agatha Christie's *The Mousetrap*. He even manages to parody his own early career as a theatre critic, highlighting how personal desires taint pompous reviews. Add in a touch of absurdism and farce and you have a hilarious murder mystery as only Stoppard can create.

Wordplay is accentuated further in *The Boundary*, a piece cowritten with Clive Exton originally for the BBC's experimental series *The Eleventh Hour*. Clever repartee and double entendre stream from the script the moment the lights come up and carry through the end. Intelligent and subtle humor, with blatantly re-used theatrical device makes this the perfect companion piece to *Hound*. I truly hope you are as entertained watching as we have been in putting the show together for you.
