# WEEK THREE: <u>Director & Playwright Bios</u>

**Deborah DeGeorge Harbin (Playwright,** *Chiquita*) discovered her love for playwriting back in 2003, when her first play, *Constellations*, won the Marc A. Klein Student Playwriting Award. She received her Master of Fine Arts degree in dramatic writing from the Catholic University of America in 2007. Since then, she has written in several genres, from theatre for young audiences to sci-fi. Her recent reimagining of a Karl Capek classic, *RUR: Reboot*, was performed in February by Run of the Mill Theatre in Baltimore, MD.

Renee Cyr (Dir, *Chiquita*) is a recent transplant to Seattle and very excited to be directing her first piece "in the real world." She is originally from VT and recently completed her undergraduate degree from Muhlenberg College in Allentown, PA where she majored in theatre (directing and performance studies) and minored in philosophy and religion. In June she moved here to work as a teaching intern at Taproot Theatre. After falling in love with Seattle she decided to move here permanently to pursue her career as a director and teaching artist. Renee wants to thank her family for all of their love and support.

Catherine Berg (Playwright, Landis and the Bear) received an MFA in Fiction from the Iowa Writer's Workshop and has written two unpublished novels. Her plays have received readings at the Circle Repertory Company, Wisconsin Public Radio, the Omaha Magic Theatre, the Shandaken Theatrical Society, and the Woodstock Fringe Festival. She lives with her partner in Kingston, NY, 100 miles up the Hudson River from NYC. She's thrilled that Landis and the Bear is being produced at Stone Soup.

**Diane Sampson (Playwright,** *How You Play the Game*) earned an M.A. in Creative Writing from SF State University. She is a member of PlayGround, a pool of 36 Bay Area playwrights working in the 10-minute play form. Her plays *Stuck, Who's My Baby Now?, The Sound of Moonlight, His New Best Friend, Facelift* and others have been produced as far afield as Miami and Los Angeles. She was

composer/lyricist for two musicals, *Oh, Progeny!* and *Writes and Rewrites*. The first, a revue about parenting, received two Bay Area productions and a staged reading at New York's York Theatre. She is currently at work on a full-length play, *Naked*, commissioned by PlayGround and due for a staged reading in May.

Rebecca Sue Haber (Playwright, *The Wedding Ring*) received her MFA in Playwriting from Columbia University School of the Arts in 2010 and has a degree in Theatre Studies from Duke University. During her final year at Columbia she was mentored by playwright Neil LaBute. In 2001 Rebecca's play *In the Garden* won best play at the Strawberry One-Act Playwriting Festival (Riant Theatre), and she was a finalist in 2002. She has since had readings at the Barrow Group and the Riant Theatre in Manhattan, and her plays have been produced at both Duke and Columbia Universities. In the fall of 2010 she finished primary production on her short film, *The Man at the Counter* (Note to Self Films) and is currently story editing Jonathan Caouette's documentary feature film *Walk Away Renee* (Tarnation Films).

**Lenore Bensinger (Dir,** *How You Play The Game & The Wedding Ring*) is mainly a new play gal, as writer, dramaturge and director. Her plays have been produced in Seattle, St. Louis, Vancouver, B.C. and LA. Favorites include *Ghost Story* and *Behind the Veil*. She's dramaturged at most Seattle area theaters. As director, her work has been seen at New City, The Group Theatre, Empty Space, local festivals, and particularly with Seattle Playwrights Alliance, where she directed staged readings and workshops. As producer, she created the first US Fringe Festival (Seattle) and *New Waves*, the Playwrights' Radio Show. She was Artistic Associate at both The Group and Empty Space Theaters.

**Kristen M. Scatton (Playwright,** *Porn for Women*) a secretary extraordinaire by day, aspiring playwright by night, is thrilled to have her West Coast debut at the Double (XX) Festival! Readings and productions of her work have been staged throughout the Philadelphia area as part of the Painted Bride Art Center's Bridal Salon (*Under Construction*), Philly's Primary Stages (*Elevator Music*; *Hell's Angels*), the Hybridge Arts Collective's "Last Monday" series (*Elevator Music*), the Art/Life Company's "Art, Life, ACTION!"

Festival (*Hell's Angels*) and the Mercer County (NJ) One-Act PlayFest (*Life of the Party; Elevator Music*). She also serves as Board Secretary for the Philadelphia Dramatists Center.

#### Kristina Hauptfeuhrer (Dir, Porn for Women)


